### Current Research

The Ambiguous Virtues of Freedom: Free Labor, Contract and the Lives of the Freed in Brazil before and after the Abolition of Slavery (scholarly monograph in progress).

This project, which will result in the completion of a scholarly monograph currently in progress, traces how the meaning of “free labor” was built in the course of the nineteenth century, on the one hand, through official legislation regarding the introduction of immigrant labor and the gradual abolition of slavery, and on the other hand by the former slaves and other workers of African descent themselves in their labor arrangements/contracts and their strategies of confrontation and accommodation to the changing legal context that characterized the period.
